





UPDATE! Phoenix Rising Book 1: Band on the Run

Status: Manuscript is complete, pending proofreading....

Want to be a Beta Reader? Limited openings are available. You MUST be sworn to secrecy.... No, wait, that's the spy thriller I was reading last night. Being a Beta Reader is fairly simple, actually; you'll get a copy of the manuscript—along with a set of questions. Your job, should you accept, is to read the questions first, then read the manuscript so you can ANSWER those questions. (The questions aren't tricky, and Yes, Cousin Morticia, you can have the questions beside you as you read, if you wish. It's NOT a college exam!) There are a few conditions (you KNEW there'd be a "gotcha," right?): You can't share the book you get, but you can keep it. You need to read it and reply to the questions within THREE weeks (the dates are still not fixed at this writing, but it will be August or very early September). If you love reading, and if you love music and quirky humor and talk of food AND you have three weeks to devote to this, I'd love to have you be one of my first Beta Readers. As I said, there are limited spots available—this won't be an army of 20 people reading (more like a small group of 3 to 5).

Anyone interested in a cover reveal? Or perhaps a PARTIAL cover reveal? My designer isn't completely finished with the cover yet, so I'm not sharing the full picture yet.... But this should give you a little idea!



For those of you who keep up with things like this, here's the "trivia" for the novel: **90,930** words; **10** chapters plus an Epilogue. There are **6** group members, **2** management people, **1** ex-lover, **1** predominant newsman plus several others, **1** precocious French translator, several detectives and bodyguards, including **1** named Robert Preston, like the old movie star..... Also in the story are **12** protesters against the Vietnam War (this novel is set in 1968, remember), plenty of police in America, Rome, Montreal, and Paris, plus bobbies in London. There's **2** caricatures, in San Francisco and Rome. There's also (to borrow a line from the Broadway musical *Oliver!*) "Food, glorious food!" Yep, lots of food throughout the book. There *may* be a companion book under consideration with further information on the foods....

I hear you asking, "What's next?" So here's the deal. In the newsletter category, you'll hear from me again in three weeks—that will be August 20. By that point, the book should be well on its path to publication—as in, it should be in the hands of the Beta Readers, or finishing up with them. After that, any necessary revisions will be made, another quick round of proofreading will follow, then the manuscript gets formatted to become an ebook and a paperback; possibly even a hard cover book. Each is a slightly different format for both the words inside the book and the beautiful covers. At that point, proof copies will be printed and reviewed with a magnifying glass (well, almost) to make sure you get the best quality e-book or paperback (or hard cover, IF I greenlight it) possible. Then, it's time to get everything ready for publication day! You might have to wait until September to be offered a chance to get an Advance Review Copy (ARC) of the book—I'll include the notice in a newsletter once the ARCs are available. And ALL of the fun and games leads up to Thursday, October 31, 2024—my current date for publication of Phoenix Rising Book 1: Band on the Run.



I guess some of you didn't really believe me that Ravynn just stepped out of my mind and introduced himself. (At least none of you called any mental health experts to come assess my stability, yet.)
